## Pizza Party Invitations

## Main Supplies:

Yellow tissue paper
Red cardstock
Tan cardstock
Circle template or something from around the house to make circles

## Basic Supplies:

## Scissors

Hole punch
Small paint brush
White paper
Brads
Pencil

## Steps:

1. Cut one $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " circle from red cardstock.
2. Cut two 4" circles from tan cardstock.
3. Create invitation on 4 " circle.
4. Using glue stick, glue red circle on one of the tan circles.
5. Put some glue on red circle and place torn pieces of yellow tissue paper for cheese. Leave wrinkles in tissue paper for a 3D effect.
6. Stack: Tan plain circle, followed by the invitation and then the pizza circle. Punch a hole through all three layers near the edge.
7. Insert a brad through the hole and bend open to secure.
8. Use the red glitter pen to make pepperoni on pizza.
9. Repeat for as many invitations as needed.
