Use netted fruit and veggie bags to create party favors or for a fun gift wrap idea.



Always cover your work surface with a mat or some type of protective covering like wax paper or plastic.

Fruit or vegetable net bag

Scrapbook paper

Embellishments-Chipboard shapes, buttons, sequin and flatback crystals



**Basic Materials:**

Paper tag

Ruler

Scissors

Decorative scissors

Stamp

Stamp pad

Lacing

Tissue paper

Tip: If your vegetable net has been sliced down the middle, you can use a sewing machine and zig-zag stitch to close it again.

Instructions:

Cut a piece of scrapbook paper 4" x 2.5" and fold in half so it measures 4" x 1.25". Paint a layer of glue on the inside of the folded paper. Place the bottom of vegetable net along the inside of the folded paper and fold, securing the net between the paper. Place between a book or add a weight on top of the folded paper while the piece dries.

Embellish the folded paper with chipboard pieces, sequins, buttons and flatback crystals. You can decorate a "to/from" tag right now as well.

Wrap the gift in a piece of tissue paper and drop inside the net bag.

String the tag onto a piece of lacing or yarn and tie around the top with a bow.
