Always cover your work surface with a mat or some type of protective covering like wax paper or plastic.

Time Needed for Project: 1 hour plus drying time

Main Supplies:

Candy bars, pencils or candy sticks
Pattern
Cardstock - assorted bright colors
Elmer's® Craft Bond™ Tacky Glue
Elmer's® School Glue Sticks






Basic Supplies:

Wiggly eyes - assorted sizes
Pencil
Ruler
Scissors
¹/₄" hole punch
Crayon

Instructions:

- 1. Trace patterns onto different colored papers then cut out. Use hole punch to create dots then cut out smaller shapes of squares, triangles etc.
- 2. To cover a candy bar, cut paper to length of bar then wrap around trimming to $\frac{1}{2}$ " overlap in back. Crease paper along back and front sides then glue overlap in place.
- 3. To hold designs to pencil or candy stick, start by cutting two thin strips of paper. Place pencil on back of base monster then press strips over pencil pushing paper close to pencil. Remove strip then add glue to tips and replace pressing tight to pencil. Repeat with a second strip.
- 4. Use Glue Stick to apply paper pieces in place creating different monsters. Use Craft Bond to glue eyes in place referring to photo for placement and color if needed. Tip: to place smaller dots or paper designs, start by adding small dots of glue where desired. Touch tip of crayon to paper piece then press into glue the crayon will hold it just longer enough to place.
