# 1407-1 Personal Space

Decorate a wall in your room with these big, colorful duct tape buttons.





Always cover your work surface with a mat or some type of protective covering like wax paper or plastic.

Age Range: 7 to 12

Grade Range: 2 to 6

Skill Level: Moderate

Time Needed for Project: 1 hour

#### Main Materials:

Colorful duct tape
12" FloraCraft® Styrofoam™ Brand Foam disc
12" FloraCraft® Styrofoam™ Brand Foam half round wreath
Elmer's® Craft Bond™ Tacky Glue



#### Basic Materials:

1" Circle cutter
Acrylic paint
Stiff paint brush
Scissors
5" square of black cardstock
1/2 yard of felt in desired color

#### Instructions:

Tip: You can use this button as a bulletin board and hang on the wall with Velcro.

Lay the wreath on top of the disc and trace the inside circle of the wreath onto the disc. Remove the wreath and paint the circle desired color. Paint just to the outside of the line to be sure no white shows around the inside of the wreath form.

Cut several 5" pieces of duct tape and wrap around the top of wreath.

When the painted section of the disc is dry, wrap the edge of the disc with duct tape so that the bottom edge of tape and disc are lined up. Cut slices into the tape all the way around the edge to create tabs and

fold over.

Glue the wreath to the disc with thick white glue.

Cut four, 1" circles from the black card stock and glue to the center with the thick white glue.

Finish by backing the button with felt. Trace the button onto the felt and cut out. Glue with the thick white glue.
