Flower Seed Gift Packets Designed by Kristin Ball

These seed packets make a great gift for anyone, especially gardeners.

Always cover your work surface with a mat or some type of protective covering like wax paper or plastic.

Time Needed for Project: 1 hour

Main Supplies:

Seed packets
Bulk seeds - 1 cup of assorted
Cardstock
Elmer's® School Glue Gel
Elmer's® Repositionable School Glue Stick





Basic Supplies:

Scissors

Decorative edge scissors
Ribbon
Hole punch
Small cello bags
Freezer paper
Masking tape
Plastic knife
Clothes pins
Craft mat

Instructions:

- 1. Tear off a piece of freezer paper slightly wider than. Place on inside of sheet shiny side up, creasing paper at sides.
- 2. Remove lid of glue then pour out entire bottle onto freezer paper using knife to spread into a thin even layer.
- 3. Immediately sprinkle on seeds evenly over glue. Set tray aside to dry this may take overnight or longer depending on humidity. The glue will release from paper when entirely dry.
- 4. Use scissors to cut out flower or irregular shapes from glue, cutting through seeds as needed, saving all excess pieces.

Cello Bag:

- 1. Fill bag with desired amount of seed shapes. Measure and cut a piece of cardstock the width of bag by 4". Fold in half then trim three edges with decorative scissors.
- 2. Remove front from seed packet and trim sides with decorative edge scissors making sure name of flower shows as shown. Insert inside of cardstock the fold up adjusting so name of flower is above fold.
- 3. Use glue stick to glue seed packet in place and cardstock to cello bag.
- 4. Punch two holes about 2" apart. Thread ribbon through holes, tie in bow then trim ends.

Seed packet:

- 1. Slit bottom end of seed packet.
- 2. Open packet and fill some excess pieces of glue with seeds.
- 3. Carefully close end matching side seams as shown. Apply glue to inside along edge then press together.
- 4. Measure and cut cardstock to fit width and about 2" or so long. Fold over top edge of packet, punch two holes, insert ribbon and tie bow.

How to use:

The glue is water soluble. Dampen ground, place seed sections into ground, cover with dirt and water again. The glue will dissolve and the flowers will sprout.
