Main Supplies:

Activa® Celluclay™ Papier Máché Twigs Brown and blue acrylic paint

Basic Supplies:
Small bowl lined with plastic wrap
String
Paint brush
Plastic fork
Measuring cup

Instructions:

Cut three or four flexible branches approximately 12" long. Wrap the branches around your hand to make a ring and tie in three spots with string.

Find a small bowl that your twig ring fits well in. Cover the small bowl in plastic wrap and place twig ring in the bowl.

Mix the papier máché according to the manufacturer's instructions. Pick up a small amount of papier máché, pat flat and stick into the center of the twig ring. Repeat until you work your way up the sides to the rim of the twig ring.

Let the nest set up for a few hours, remove from the bowl and leave to dry.

Use the remaining papier máché to roll three small eggs to go into the nest.

Once your pieces are dry, you can paint them with acrylic paint. Dip your brush in water and then into the paint to create a wash over the nest.

Paint the eggs blue. Create speckled eggs by adding touches of brown paint with the end of the paint brush.

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
