Main Supplies:

FloraCraft® Styrofoam™ Brand Foam: 1- 1" \times 12" disk, 1- 2" ball and 1- 3" egg Elmer's® Craft Bond™ Tacky Glue Elmer's® Painters® Markers - black Pepperell® Brain Noodles™ - large chenille stems 2" wood circles, $\frac{1}{2}$ wood circles, craft sticks, 2" teardrop shapes, five or six 1" or $\frac{1}{2}$ " wood circles for each alien for spots





Basic Supplies:

½" dowel cut to size appropriate to child

Acrylic paint - your choice of colors

16 oz. plastic cups

Large (16mm) Wiggle eyes

Glitter chenille stems, colors of choice, pom-poms (1" in color of choice)

Plastic knife, wax candle

Scissors

Wood Skewers

Scraps of Styrofoam

Paintbrushes - one stiff, one soft

Instructions:

- 1. Use black marker to trace wide mouth of cup on each disk, approx 1-2 from bottom of one edge of disk. Use wax knife to coat butter knife and carefully cut out traced circle to form mouth.
- 2. Using a stiff brush, paint the Styrofoam pieces with the acrylic paint.
- 3. Using a soft brush, paint the wooden pieces.
- 4. When pieces are dry, refer to photo to glue eyes and circles on each alien. Let dry thoroughly before handling.
- 5. When dry, insert cup into mouth and with glue placed on edges and let dry. Place glue on ends of stems and insert into top of disks for antennae. Glue pom-poms to ends of stems. Use black marker to outline wood teardrops and crafts sticks and for numbers on each teardrop. Glue teardrop to top of craft stick and glue craft stick to back of disks.
- 6. Insert dowel into one thick end of egg. Remove and place glue on end of dowel. Reinsert to form putter. Let dry. Use remaining foam ball for golf ball.
