Button Tick, Tack, Toe

Play tic, tack, toe with colorful foam playing pieces.

Main Materials:

FloraCraft® Styrofoam™ Brand Foam - 12" x 12"
Blumenthal Lansing® Buttons
Elmer's® Craft Bond™ Tacky Glue



Basic Materials:

Straight pins
Rickrack - 3 yards
Stiff brush
Pencil
Plastic knife and candle
Acrylic paint - 3 different colors
Glass or round cookie cutter (approximately 1 ½" in diameter)

Instructions:

1. Using one of the 12" x 12" sheets, cut out 5 - 1 ½" squares using the ruler and plastic knife. Tip: Wax knife with candle, this makes it easier to cut the Styrofoam.

2. Using the same sheet, use a glass or cookie cutter to cut out 5 circles from the Styrofoam.
3. Paint the remaining 12" x 12" sheet with acrylic paint using a stiff brush. This will become the game board. Let dry.
4. Paint the circles one color and the squares a different color. Let dry.
5. Cut 4 - 12" pieces of rickrack. Glue them to the top of the game board making the tic tac toe lines (see picture). Glue additional rickrack around the outer edge. Hold in place while it dries with straight pins.
6. Glue buttons to the tops of the game pieces.
